

TRURO TO PERRANWELL



Walk Three: Distance: Approximately 7 miles

Walk Three

A walk with varied scenery using the disused Newham railway line, quiet residential roads, fields, woods and tracks. The walk can be shortened by catching the bus from or to Playing Place*.

From Truro Station – Cross the road via the island in front of the station. Go up Station Road, crossing two roads before turning left at Old County Hall. Leaving the main building to your right go up to the main road. Turn right to the controlled crossing to New County Hall. Continue on at the roundabout to turn left through a wide gateway almost opposite Aldi's. Go down around the perimeter of New County Hall. Just before the road turn right up to the disused railway line. Turn left and follow the track to where it meets a road.

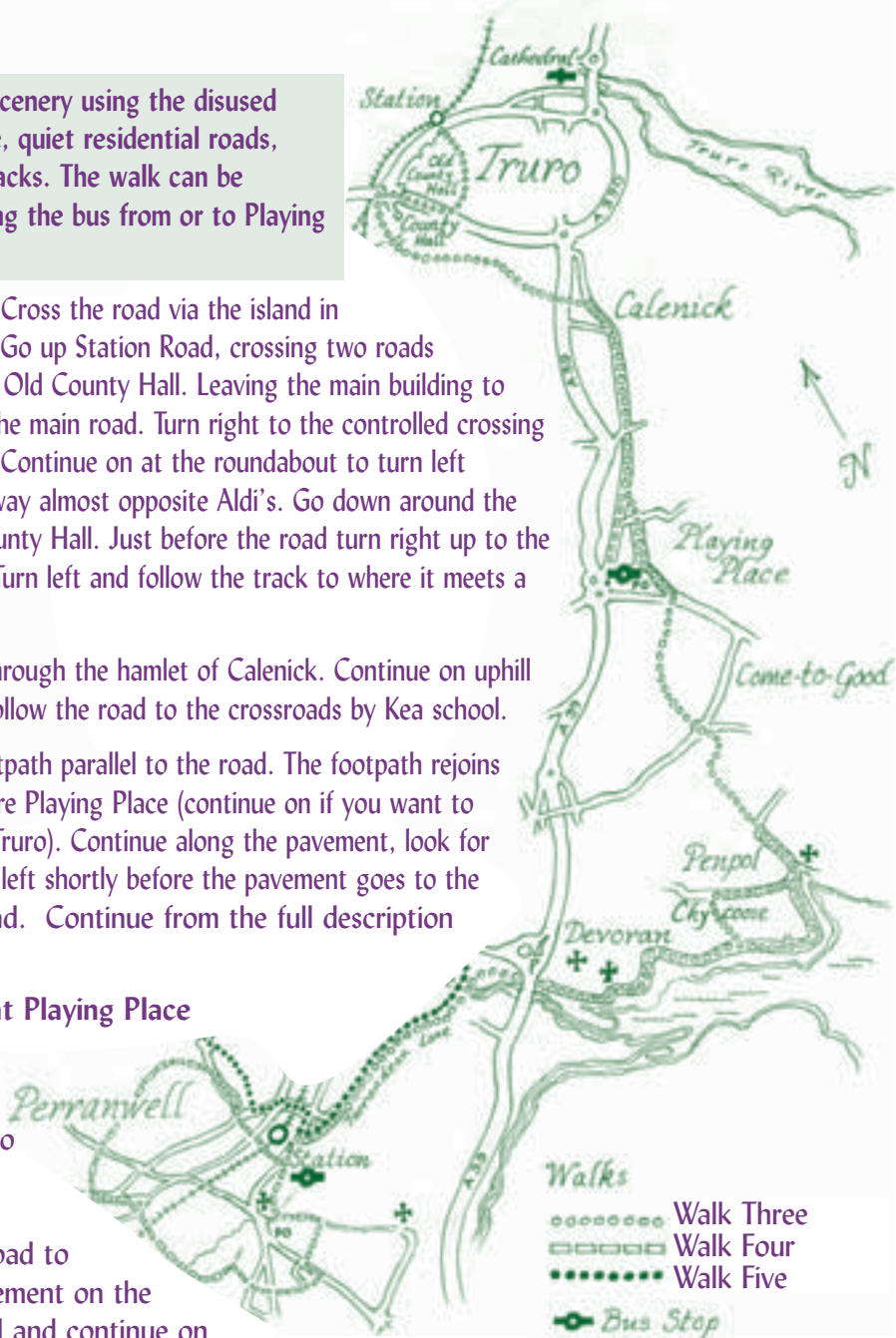
Turn right downhill through the hamlet of Calenick. Continue on uphill at the junction and follow the road to the crossroads by Kea school.

Continue on to a footpath parallel to the road. The footpath rejoins the road shortly before Playing Place (continue on if you want to catch a bus back to Truro). Continue along the pavement, look for a footpath off to the left shortly before the pavement goes to the other side of the road. Continue from the full description at **.

To join the route at Playing Place

From the bus stop, with its shelter behind you, cross to the road opposite.

This is Old Coach Road. Follow the road to the end of the pavement on the left. Cross the road and continue on for a few yards to a path on your right.

** Follow the path to Carlyon Park (a road you will cross) passing 'The Rounds' information stone. At the road continue into Penhalls Way, to a T-junction, turn left and on to a second T-junction.

Cross the grassed area to your right then go over the road (the B3289 which leads to the A39) to a stile to the right of a metal farm gate. Over the stile, go diagonally to the left to the farm track.

Where the track turns right, go over the stile ahead and follow the fencing on the right. Continue on through the gateway ahead into another field where the path goes left

downhill into a wooded area. Go over a stile to your left, cross the stream and follow the path through the wood. Leave the wood via another stile and on, passing a property on your left, down the track to the thatched Quaker Chapel at Come to Good. 🍄🍄🍄

Turn left, passing Come to Good farm to a gate into a field on your right. Through this follow the fencing to the second gate. Now go down diagonally to the right to a kissing gate and a copped area (another stile) and on through a latched gate by a dwelling on the left. Continue down the track, passing 'out buildings', to join the road by Piper's Barn. Go down the road to the road bridge on your right - signed to Chycoose and Carnon Downs. **Now there is a choice:**

a) Continue on down the road and round to the right to follow the road to Devoran – beware of the traffic. **Or**

b) Turn right at the bridge and go uphill to a bridlepath on your left after 'Restharrow'. Follow it, going right uphill where the path forks, to the road. Go up to your right to the footpath ahead. Follow this through the hamlet of Chycoose and on uphill to follow the track through a gate and on along the edge of the field. Go through a gate and then another gate on your left. Continue on along the line of the path, through a cultivated area, to a gate onto a drive to the right of a building. Turn left down to the road, then right. Follow the road to Devoran, keeping to the lower road. Pass the village hall on your right and cross Market Street, and go along Greenbank Road. #

Turn left to the cycle track crossing. **TAKE GREAT CARE CROSSING THIS VERY BUSY ROAD** to the Devoran to Portreath tramway. Follow Greenbank road and continue on as it becomes the cycle track for the Devoran to Portreath tramway. Your route passes under the realigned A39 (Truro to Falmouth road). Follow the track to the Carnow river. Cross the timber footbridge and turn right along a track, with the river on your right, to a tarmac path. Bear right on to this path which becomes an uphill unmade lane (Torranean lane). Ignore side lanes. Where the lane forks, take the left lane which leads to Perranwell station. #
